



St. Margaret's C.E.P PE and Sports Grant

Key Principles

We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities in PE are high quality and meet the needs of all pupils so that they can achieve their potential. We provide a broad PE curriculum. The Sports Funding is allocated and targeted following a needs analysis which identifies priority classes and groups who need to increase their participation in PE and Sport.

At St. Margaret's we have strategically utilised this funding through:

- Maintaining our provision of specialist sports staff to deliver a range of PE and sports for all our children
- Providing extra- curricular sports clubs offered to all pupils, including competitive sports opportunities.
- Enhancing our sports equipment and resources enabling all children to reach maximum skills levels.
- Extending our outdoor play equipment in order to further develop health and well-being for all children.

Summary of expenditure 2016 to 17

- Three days of professional sports package commissioned to provide high quality sports coaching to all children - £6 000
- Outdoor play equipment - £2 300

Impact/outcomes 2016 to 17

- New experiences and development of skills provided for the children. Children access a range of sports both competitive and non-competitive.
- Sports staff are beginning to work with school on assessment and tracking of pupil progress.
- Children have access to innovative play equipment lending

themselves to safe risks that liberate their imagination and further stimulate creativity.
